CHAPTER VII One Hundred Consecutive Cases Of Twilight Sleep At The Mary Thompson Hospital, June 1 To December 1, 1914 BEGAN using scopolamine in obstetrics about eight years ago, but gave it up after a short experience. This early experience demonstrated to my satisfaction that scopolamine-morphine shortened the first stage of labor. I gave at that time 1/100 grain of scopolamine and *4 grain of morphine as the initial dose and expected to repeat it in four hours unless the cervix was completely dilated. The injection was never given until the pains were strong and regular, and my experience was that at the end of two or three hours after the injection the cervix was completely dilated. I feared at this time to repeat the dose, so the labor was completed by using a little chloroform for the delivery of the head. This...

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
